## Legislative Officer Morris Zupan

#### **LEGISLATIVE REPORT AS OF 11/3/23 (Pending Legislation)**

1. Social Security Fairness Act of 2023 (H.R. 82/ S. 597)

Repeals the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and Government Pension Offset (GPO).

Current Status: Per the November 2023 NARFE Magazine – House cosponsors 293, and Senate cosponsors 45.

January 2023 was referred to the House Ways and Means Committee.

March 2023 was referred to the Senate Finance Committee (we have asked both the National NARFE Headquarters and our NARFE to contact our representatives asking for the co-sponsorship).

House: 290 co-sponsors are needed for 25 days to get a floor vote on the Act. There are two other 'acts' in Congress that will eliminate WEP/GPO, but they have relatively lower co-sponsors for further movement.

H.R. 4583/S. 2280: is one of them. This one expands and strengthens social security and improves the solvency of the Social Security Trust Fund while eliminating WEP/GPO. House co-sponsors 178, and 5enate co-sponsors 5.

July 2023: Referred to the House Ways and Means Committee, and July 2023 referred to the Senate Finance Committee.

2. H.R. 716: The Fair Cola (Cost of Living Adjustment) for Seniors Act:

The Act would use the Consumer Price Index for the elderly as the basis for the COLA retirement benefit. House co-sponsors 28.

3. H.R. 866: The Equal COLA Act:

The act provides equal COLA amounts for the Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS), as it does for the Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS). House co-sponsors 38.

#### 4. Other pending Acts:

It does not directly relate to the retirees, but one is related to a government shutdown. H.R. 1301/S 640. The Act protects Federal workers and contractors from a variety of civil service financial penalties during a lapse of appropriations such as a government shutdown. House co-sponsors 2, Senate co-sponsors 16.

General status of moving 'Acts' into Bills for votes to become laws: The status is 'slow' at best. During our October 12<sup>th</sup> meeting, the House of Representatives was meeting to count votes to determine the Speaker of the House. The Speaker was not determined until two weeks later (10/25/23). During this time, no Appropriations or movement from 'Acts' into Bills were made per the NARFE weekly statement of October 30<sup>th</sup>. After three weeks of tumult, the US House of Representatives elected a new Speaker, Mike Johnson (R-LA).

Speaker Johnson's and the House's immediate actions are: Passing existing Appropriations Bills, as well as passing a budget before November 17<sup>th</sup>, most probably a continuing resolution through January 15<sup>th</sup> or April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024. The 'Acts' listed above in our interest are really not in the 2023 picture.

History of Veteran's Day

Veterans Day, originally celebrated as Armistice Day, was first issued on November 11, 1919, by President Woodrow Wilson a year after the end of World War I. The purpose of Armistice Day was to honor the fallen soldiers of the Great War for their sacrifice and bravery. Seven years later, in 1926, Congress adopted a resolution requesting that President Calvin Coolidge issue annual proclamations on November 11, making Armistice Day a legal holiday. In 1945, World War II veteran Raymond

Weeks had the idea to expand Armistice Day to celebrate all veterans rather than just the ones who died in World War I. He led a delegation to General Dwight D. Eisenhower, who was all for the idea. Weeks then organized the first Veterans Day celebration in 1945 in Alabama and every year since, until he died in 1985. In 1982, President Reagan with the Presidential Citizenship Medal honored him. Weeks was also named the 'Father of Veterans Day' by Elizabeth Dole.

In 1954, Ed Rees, the U.S. Representative from Emporia, Kansas, presented a bill to establish the holiday to Congress.

Eisenhower, who was then the president and also from Kansas, signed the bill into law on May 26, 1954, eight and a half years after Raymond Weeks held the first Veterans Day. After having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress—at the urge of the veterans' service organizations—amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word 'Armistice' and inserting the word 'Veterans.' With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars. (SPOUSES INCLUDED)
